### Parish Pastoral Council

The next meeting of the parish council will look at preparations for Lent and Holy Week in the parish as well as some issues from our association with neighbouring parishes in our new pastoral area.

## Trócaire

This year’s Lent Campaign accompanies a three-generation family in rural Rwanda, led by Uwamahoro, a young mother supporting her daughter, niece and elderly mother. Uwamahoro works from 7am until 1pm every day, when she goes home to help her mother in the house. The grandmother of the family, 68 year old Verediana, lives with a disability and is unable to work. The family do not have any livestock or land, so they are solely reliant on Uwamahoro’s income to buy food, along with whatever they can gather themselves from around the local community, such as cassava leaves and beans, which she pounds down to make a stew. She said, “you can’t work for 1,000 Rwandan Francs and get lunch and supper for the family - that’s why we only take supper in the evening. If we had money to get lunch, we would also be happy to have lunch as well.”

## **Work on Church Grounds**

To facilitate work next door, scaffolding will be erected along the wall of the church grounds for a few weeks. One of the pedestrian gates will be closed off but the other pedestrian access gate will be open at all times. A health and safety review was undertaken and an inspection of plans carried out by Allianz insurance on behalf of the parish. A hoarding will be set up to safeguard the work and a temporary footpath will be created around it which will be lit up. The site will be checked daily until the work is completed. ## **Boardsmill Church**

An inspection of the roof on Boardsmill church was done last month following a major leak before Christmas. Substantial repairs will be required. Local knowledge tells us that work has not been carried out on the roof of Boardsmill church in at least 40 years and we are reliably informed that unless the present work is done the condition of the roof will further deteriorate and we will face even greater challenges down the road. The Finance Committee reviewed the matter at the meeting on 4 February. An initial quotation estimates that the work will cost €48,882. Funding for this project has to be explored before the work can begin.
