"Fasting from harsh words during Lent"

Let us begin by disarming our language, avoiding harsh words and rash judgement, refraining from slander and speaking ill of those who are not present and cannot defend themselves. Instead, let us strive to measure our words and cultivate kindness and respect in our families, among our friends, at work, on social media, in political debates, in the media and in Christian communities. In this way, words of hatred will give way to words of hope and peace.

Trócaire: weekly update from the box

This year's Trocaire box features Uwamahoro, a young mother supporting her daughter, niece and elderly mother. The house Uwamahoro's family live in is a small mudbrick structure with three small, virtually empty rooms. With no electricity or windows, the family live in near total darkness all day and night. They used to have a separate outdoor kitchen where they could cook safely and burn firewood for the stove without smoke filling the house, but a heavy rainstorm destroyed the kitchen so Uwamahoro cooks using a small pot and some firewood in the back room of the house, while her mother and the children stay in another room to avoid the smoke. Losing her kitchen is just one of the many ways the increasingly severe rainstorms have impacted Uwamahoro and her family.
