Pilgrimage of Hope for the Jubilee Year - Saturday 21 June at 12 noon



You are invited to journey the pilgrim path of Hope in Trim and reflect on the message of Hope this Jubilee Year.

Saint Patrick's Cathedral (Church of Ireland)

St. Patrick's Cathedral is believed to be on the site of the first church built in the area by St. Patrick. The church was largely reconstructed in 1802. It was elevated to the status of Cathedral in 1955, thus providing the Church of Ireland diocese of Meath with a mother church.

2. St Mary's Abbey & Yellow Steeple

These are the remains of the Augustinian monastery of St. Mary's which was founded in the twelfth century. The Yellow Steeple, the bell tower for the Abbey, was probably built in the 14th century. St. Mary's was the centre of great medieval pilgrimages to the miraculous statue of Our Lady of Trim..

3. Cathedral of St Peter and St Paul & Victorine Friary, Newtown

Simon de Rochfort, the first Norman Bishop of the diocese of Meath in 1194, got permission to transfer his seat from Clonard to Newtown, Trim and had this cathedral built in 1206. He added the Victorine Abbey at the same time for the Canons Regular of St. Victor who undertook to look after the Cathedral.

4. Newtown Parish Church: The Dillon Tomb

This, the small medieval parish church of Newtown contains this late sixteenth century tomb of Sir Lucas Dillon and his wife, Lady Jane Bathe, known as the 'Tomb of the Jealous Man and Woman'. The effigies on the tomb portray Sir Lucas and his wife in Elizabethan dress with a sword dividing the couple.

5. Priory of St. John the Baptist, Newtown

A hospital was founded here in the thirteenth century by the Crutched Friars, an order originally established to nurse the Crusaders.. The remains include a large square keep with two towers, a round watch tower, the hospital building, and a chapel with a triple window.

6. Maudlin Cemetery & Our Lady of Trim statue.

The Maudlins Cemetery was the site of the Leper Hospital and church of Mary Magdalen. Later the cemetery was utilised as a burial ground for the poor who died in the nearby workhouse, established in the early 1840s. In 1976 the bronze sculpture of 'Our Lady of Trim', by Christopher Ryan, was erected

7. St. Patrick's Church (Roman Catholic)

The foundation stone for St. Patrick's Church was laid by Dr. Nulty, the Bishop of Meath in 1891. The building was designed by William Hague in French Gothic style. The building was delayed as a result of the Parnellite split. The church was dedicated on the 12th October 1902 by Bishop Gaffney.


